NFCC Minority Leadership Program

Definition:

The Minority Leadership Program is a resource for area minority students who plan to attend NFCC. Program participants will receive educational scholarships and guidance to help them succeed and grow academically and individually.

Goals:

- Students will learn about leadership, building stronger communities and how to address important social, cultural, economic and health related issues.
- Students will be empowered to become leaders on campus, in their own communities and beyond.
- Students will be encouraged to be role models for future NFCC students and program participants.

Students:

- Apply/Submit application by Aug. 6 to be considered for the Fall Term 2009 program. Fall classes begin Aug. 24.

Community: (how you can help)

- Encourage a minority student to attend college at NFCC
- Mentor a student applying for the Minority Leadership Program
- Support the program financially or by donating your time. With your support this program can grow and reach more students in the future.

Student Scholarships

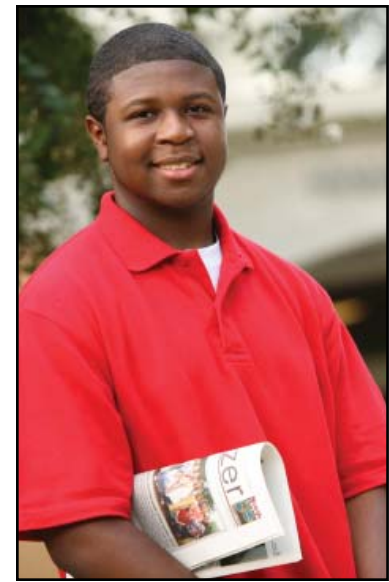
Full tuition, two-year academic scholarships for a degree or certificate program at NFCC

Eligibility Requirements / Application Process:

- Be one of the following recognized minorities: Hispanic, Black, American Indian or Alaska Native, Asian, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander
- Be a resident of one of the following counties: Hamilton, Jefferson, Lafayette, Madison, Suwannee or Taylor County
- Meet NFCC admission requirements
- Complete and submit a FAFSA (Federal Student Aid) form
- Submit high school transcript; -or- GED along with birth certificate
- Submit letter of recommendation from an organization or individual who can attest to the applicant's character and desire to succeed. Organization or individual must agree to mentor and support applicant through his or her first year of attendance at NFCC. *This may include accompanying the student to program seminars or meetings with an academic advisor.*
- Complete and submit NFCC Minority Leadership Program Application including required essay (*see application for details*)

Selection Process:

- Candidates selected by NFCC review committee
- Fifteen candidates selected to participate in program Fall Term 2009
- If notified of acceptance, candidates must inform NFCC in writing of their decision to accept scholarship by designated date. Failure to do so will result in the scholarship being awarded to another candidate.

Continued Eligibility:

- Scholarship recipients must maintain a 2.5 GPA
