## NOTIFICATION OF SOCIAL SECURITY CARD NUMBER COLLECTION AND USE

In compliance with Florida Statute (F.S.) 119.071(5)(a), North Florida Community College (NFCC) issues this notification regarding the purpose for the collection and use of your Social Security Number (SSN). In addition, 119.071(2)(a)(II), F.S., authorizes NFCC to collect and use your SSN to perform

the College's duties and responsibilities for the following purposes: student record management; identification and verification; tracking (also authorized by 1008.386, F.S.); VA benefits (also mandated by 38 USC 3471); and reporting to authorized agencies of the state and federal government (also authorized by 26 USC 6050S). To protect your identity, NFCC will maintain the privacy of your SSN and never release it to unauthorized parties. The College assigns you a unique student identification number which is used for educational purposes at NFCC, including access of your college records.

## ADMISSIONS

All students must be admitted before registration for courses can occur. An application for admission must be on file for the program that you wish to pursue. Programs with additional requirements include Emergency Medical Technician, Paramedic, Registered Nursing, Licensed Practical Nurse, Patient Care Assistant, Law Enforcement Basic Recruit and Corrections Basic Recruit. Should a student have any question regarding admission, he or she should contact the Admissions Office at 850/973-1622 or 850/973-9405.

### A new student should:

- Submit an application for admission with required \$20 nonrefundable fee.
- Submit official transcripts from the high school and each previous college, university, or technical school attended.
- Submit test scores (see

placement testing information).

## **Returning Students:**

If you have been out of school one year or more, you must:

- Submit a Readmission Application (no fee required).
- Submit official transcripts from each college, university or technical school previously attended since the term you were last registered at NFCC.
- A new application for admission is required if you change your program of study, (i.e., if you were a dual enrolled student who has graduated from high school, if you were a degree seeking student who intends to earn a vocational certificate, or if you were a GED student who has received a GED certificate and intends to complete requirements for a vocational certificate or an associate degree.)

## **PLACEMENT TESTING INFORMATION**

All students entering degree programs, taking degree-credit courses, or any level of English, math, or reading courses must take a placement test before registering. ACT, SAT, and CPT are accepted. PSAV (Vocational Certificate) programs must take the T.A.B.E. (Test of Adult Basic Education). Students entering Corrections or Law Enforcement must take the CJBAT test. Scores may be no more than two years old. Testing Schedule: Call 850/973-9451 or 973-1665 to schedule

## **MYNFCC INFORMATION NETWORK**

MyNFCC's Information Network is a self serve database that allows students to register for classes, view grades, check financial aid status and update personal information.

### **Logging into the Information Network:**

1. From the NFCC website (<http://www.nfcc.edu>) click the "MyNFCC Information Network" link.
2. See an academic advisor.
2. Click "Enter Secure Area"
3. Enter your student ID number and pin in the appropriate fields:
  - Your NFCC student ID number can be found on the top of your class schedule
  - "G" must be capitalized and all other characters are numeric
  - Your pin, unless changed, is your date of birth (mmddyy)
  - If you have changed or are unsure of your pin, click the "Reset Pin" button and you will be prompted to answer a security question.
4. Click Login

**NOTE: The welcome message at the top of the page will provide you with your D2L and GoMail username.**

## **DESIRE2LEARN**

Desire2Learn is the learning management system that houses our online and supplemented face-2-face courses. Logging into your online or supplemented course:

1. From the NFCC website (<http://www.nfcc.edu>) click the D2L link or type the NFCC online URL into the internet address bar: <http://online.nfcc.edu>
2. Enter your username and password in the appropriate fields on the D2L homepage
  - Your username must be obtained through the NFCC Information network.
  - Your password is "welcome" the first time you log in.
  - Click on the Login button, to access your D2L homepage
  - You will see your course(s) listed under "My Courses"
  - Click the name of the course to begin

## REFUND POLICY

Refund of tuition and fees is based upon the following regulations: A registered student must officially drop a course or officially withdraw from college to receive a refund of fees. Students officially withdrawing no later than the day listed in the college calendar are eligible for refund of fees as follows:

- A. Refund of 100 percent of matriculation and tuition fees will be made when the College cancels a class.
- B. Refund of 100 percent of matriculation and tuition fees will be made when a student withdraws from or drops a course before the last day to add classes. After this date, no refunds will be made for course drops.
- C. Before refunds are disbursed, outstanding indebtedness to the College must be paid.
- D. In the case of extreme personal or family hardship, or in cases involving extenuating circumstances, the Dean of Enrollment and Student Services may waive the above regulations.

## FEES FOR RETAKING COURSES

Section 240.124 Florida Statutes mandates that each student attempting the same non-repeatable undergraduate course more than twice beginning with the Fall Semester 1997 shall be assessed an additional per credit hour surcharge beginning with the third attempt. Attempted hours include those hours dropped, withdrawn and repeated under NFCC forgiveness policy which are fee liable.

The only exceptions:

- Any course taken prior to the fall 1997.
- Attempts taken at an institution other than NFCC.
- Any non fee-liable course dropped or withdrawn.

## TUITION-FREE COURSES FOR THOSE SIXTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER

Adults 65 years of age or older may apply for admission as a senior citizen. The admission requirements applicable to students under this category include the completion of an application as non-degree seeking/senior citizen and payment of the one-time \$20.00 application fee. This is a special category status and is not an alternate form of admission for the career and technical or associate degree programs. Those applying for admission as senior citizens may register up to 4 credit hours per semester. Tuition is waived but the student is responsible for the purchase of textbooks, instructional materials, and other fees required for the course.

## EXCESS HOURS ADVISORY STATEMENT

Section 1009.286, Florida Statutes, establishes an "excess hour" surcharge for a student seeking a baccalaureate degree at a state university. It is critical that students including those entering Florida Colleges are aware of the potential for additional course fees. "Excess hours" are defined as hours that go beyond 120% of the hours required for a baccalaureate degree program. For example, if the length of the program is 120 credit hours, the student may be subject to an excess hour surcharge for any credits attempted beyond 144 credit hours (12 x 120%). All students whose educational plan may include earning a bachelor's degree should make every effort to enroll in and successfully complete those courses that are required for their intended major on their first attempt. Florida College students intending to transfer to a state university should identify a major or "transfer program" early and be advised of admission requirements for that program, including the approved common prerequisites. Course withdrawals and/or repeats, as well as enrollment in courses non-essential to the intended major, may contribute to a potential excess hour surcharge.

## CLAS - COLLEGE LEVEL ACADEMIC SKILLS

- College Level Academic Skills (CLAS), created by the Florida State Board of Education, requires students to demonstrate proficiency in communication and computation prior to graduating.
- College Level Academic Skills Test (CLAST) is no longer available after June 30, 2009.
- Students aspiring to receive an A.A. degree or to transfer to a university with 60 or more credits must meet CLAS requirements in order to graduate. Students can use a combination of ACT, CPT, SAT I or 2.5 GPA in certain courses to meet the College Level Academic Skills (CLAS) requirement.
- For more information, refer to the NFCC website or the College Catalog.

## GRADUATION

Students must apply in writing for graduation. Graduation applications are available in the Registrar's Office. Students must complete a graduation application, in order to receive a diploma or certificate, even if they do not desire to participate in the commencement ceremony. See the calendar for deadlines concerning graduation.

## COLLEGE CLOSING PROCEDURES FOR WEATHER EMERGENCY

The College switchboard will have its message modified, conditions permitting, to indicate the closing status. If the College is not closed, but your area has emergency weather situations that may prevent you from attending class, you are advised to make your own decision concerning your safety. 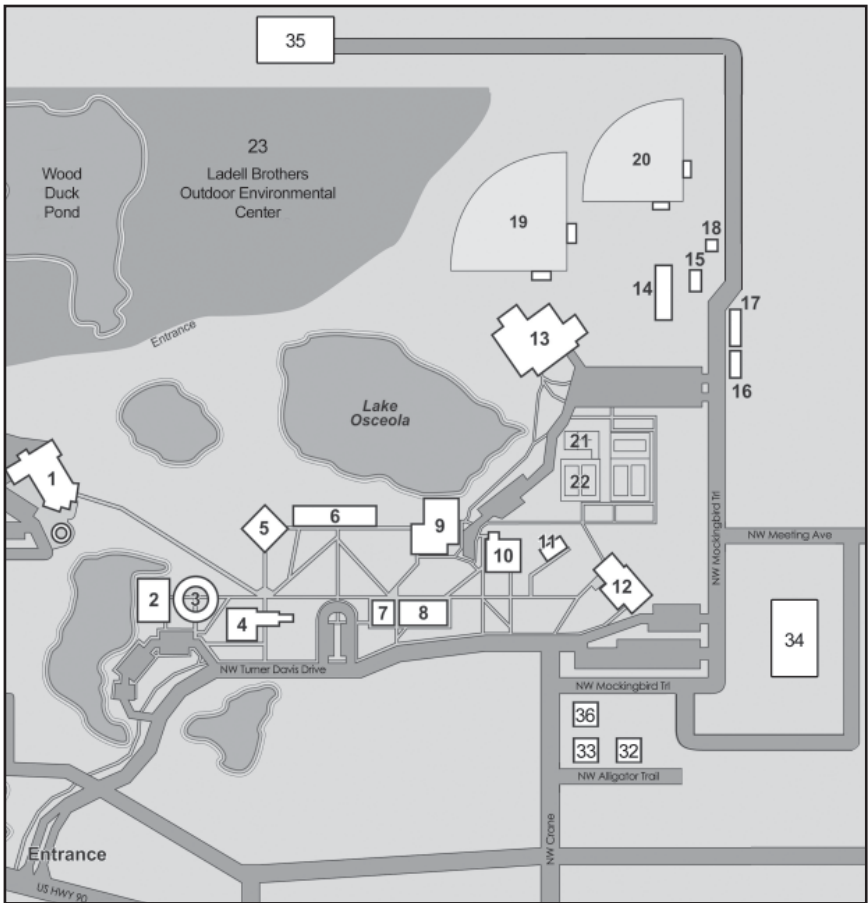
