Thursday, Nov. 4, 2010 - 6:30 p.m.

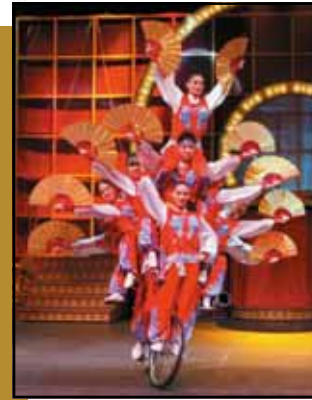
