NOTIFICATION OF SOCIAL SECURITY CARD NUMBER COLLECTION & USE

North Florida Community College collects your social security number for use in performance of the College's duties and responsibilities for the following possible purposes: classification of accounts; identification and verification; credit worthiness; billing and payments; data collections; reconciliation; tracking, benefit processing; tax and scholarship reporting; financial aid processing; accreditation of programs; and reporting to authorized agencies of the state and federal government. Social security numbers are also used as a unique numeric identifier in certain cases and may be used for research purposes. Federal law requires that we protect social security numbers from disclosure to unauthorized parties. Students and employees are assigned NFCC identification numbers to assist in protecting their identities. For more information, refer to the NFCC website or the College Catalog.

ADMISSIONS

All students must be admitted before registration for courses can occur. An application for admission must be on file for the program that you wish to pursue. Programs with additional requirements include Emergency Medical Technician, Paramedic, Registered Nursing, Licensed Practical Nurse, Patient Care Assistant, Law Enforcement Basic Recruit and Corrections Basic Recruit. Should a student have any question regarding admission, he or she should contact the Admissions Office at 850/973-1622 or 850/973-9405.

A new student should:

- Submit an application for admission with the required \$20 nonrefundable application fee.
- Submit official transcripts from the high school and each previous college, university, or technical school attended.

- Submit test scores (see placement testing information).

Returning Students:

If you have been out of school one year or more, you must:

- Submit a Readmission Application (no fee required).
- Submit official transcripts from each college, university, or technical school previously attended since the term you were last registered at NFCC.
- A new application for admission is required if you change your program of study, (i.e., if you were a dual enrolled student who has graduated from high school, if you were a degree seeking student who intends to earn a vocational certificate, or if you were a GED student who has received a GED certificate and intends to complete requirements for a vocational certificate or an associate degree.)

PLACEMENT TESTING INFORMATION

All students entering degree programs, taking degree-credit courses, or any level of English, math, or reading courses must take a placement test before registering. ACT, SAT, CPT, and PERT are accepted. PSAV (Vocational Certificate) programs must take the T.A.B.E. (Test of Adult Basic Education). Students entering Corrections or Law Enforcement must take the CJBAT test. Scores may be no more than two years old.

MyNFCC INFORMATION NETWORK

MyNFCC's Information Network is a self serve database that allows students to register for classes, view grades, check financial aid status and update personal information.

Logging into the Information Network:

2. Click "Enter Secure Area"
3. Enter your student ID number and pin in the appropriate fields:

- Your NFCC student ID number can be found on the top of your class schedule
 - “G” must be capitalized and all other characters are numeric
 - Your pin, unless changed, is your date of birth (mmddyyyy)
 - If you have changed or are unsure of your pin, click the “Reset Pin” button and you will be prompted to answer a security question.
4. Click Login

NOTE: The welcome message at the top of the page will provide you with your D2L and GoMail username.

DESIRE2LEARN

Desire2Learn is the learning management system that houses our online and supplemented face-2-face courses. Logging into your online or supplemented course:

1. From the NFCC website (<http://www.nfcc.edu>) click the D2L link or type the NFCC online URL into the internet address bar: <http://online.nfcc.edu>
2. Enter your username and password in the appropriate fields on the D2L homepage
 - Your username must be obtained through the NFCC Information network.
 - Your password is “welcome” the first time you log in.
 - Click on the Login button, to access your D2L homepage
 - You will see your course(s) listed under “My Courses”

- Click the name of the course to begin

GoMail is the official email communication tool for NFCC.

Logging into your GoMail account:

 - Your username must be obtained through the NFCC Information network.
 - Your password is the same as your Information Network pin
 - Your password is only 6 characters and can be reset through the Information Network “Reset PIN” link

E2CAMPUS

Keeping students current on campus emergencies

E2campus is an emergency alert system that allows you to receive text messages or emails in the event of a campus-wide emergency or closing due to inclement weather. Registering your phone takes only a few minutes. NOTE: After creating an account a validation code will be sent to your cellular phone via text. Your account will not be activated until you log in to e2Campus and input the validation code.

REFUND POLICY

Refund of tuition and fees is based upon the following regulations: A registered student must officially drop a course or officially withdraw from college to receive a refund of fees. Students officially withdrawing no later than the day listed in the college calendar are eligible for refund of fees as follows:

ADDITIONAL FEES ASSOCIATED WITH ALLIED HEALTH PROGRAMS AND PUBLIC SAFETY PROGRAMS ARE REQUIRED. CONTACT THE PROGRAM DIRECTOR FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION.

- A. Refund of 100 percent of matriculation and tuition fees will be made when a class is cancelled by the College.
- B. Refund of 100 percent of matriculation and tuition fees will be made when a student withdraws from or drops a course before the last day to add classes. After this date, no refunds will be made for course drops.
- C. Before refunds are disbursed, outstanding indebtedness to the College must be paid.
- D. In the case of extreme personal or family hardship, or in cases involving extenuating circumstances, the Dean of Enrollment and Student Services may waive the above regulations.

FEES FOR RETAKING COURSES

Section 240.124 Florida Statutes mandates that each student attempting the same non-repeatable undergraduate course more than twice beginning with the Fall Semester 1997 shall be assessed an additional per credit hour surcharge beginning with the third attempt. Attempted hours include those hours dropped, withdrawn and repeated under NFCC forgiveness policy which are fee liable. The only exceptions:

- Any course taken prior to the fall 1997.
- Attempts taken at an institution other than NFCC.
- Any non fee-liable course dropped or withdrawn.

Out-of-state fees are assessed to individuals upon the third attempt to satisfactorily complete a course that is not designated as a repeatable course in the College Catalog and course schedule. The additional tuition and fees may be waived by the Dean of Academic Affairs. To apply for consideration for the waiver of the additional fees that are assessed on the third attempt, the student must submit a completed Petition for Exemption from Full Cost of Instruction form, a letter addressed to the Dean of Academic Affairs, and a copy of their academic record. The petition must be submitted and approved by the end of the drop/add period for the term in which the student

would like to attempt the course. A fourth attempt may be allowed only through an academic appeals process based on major extenuating circumstances. Contact the Office of Enrollment Services for more information.

TUITION-FREE COURSES FOR THOSE SIXTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE & OLDER

Adults 65 years of age or older may apply for admission as a senior citizen. The admission requirements applicable to students under this category include the completion of an application as non-degree seeking/senior citizen and payment of the one-time \$20.00 application fee. This is a special category status and is not an alternate form of admission for the career and technical or associate degree programs. Those applying for admission as senior citizens may register up to 4 credit hours per semester. Tuition is waived but the student is responsible for the purchase of textbooks, instructional materials, and other fees required for the course.

CANCELLED COURSES

The College reserves the right to cancel courses when necessary. Students will receive full refunds for cancelled courses.

COLLEGE CLOSING PROCEDURES FOR WEATHER EMERGENCY

The College switchboard will have its message modified, conditions permitting, to indicate the closing status. The Governor has created an Internet site that directs the public to shelter during a hurricane evacuation. The web address is www.floridadisaster.org.

If the College is not closed, but your area has emergency weather situations that may prevent you from attending class, you are advised to make your own decision concerning your safety. You are responsible for discussing the situation with your instructor to determine how to deal with the extenuating circumstances.

FIRST CLASS MEETING / ATTENDANCE REVIEW

You are expected to attend the first class meeting. All courses are monitored for regular attendance by students. Students who register for classes, but have not attended after the close of registration, will be withdrawn as a "no show." Students taking an on-line course must contact the instructor by the end of the first week of classes.

ENROLLMENT VERIFICATION

All student enrollment verification will be by official request only. Verification letters will not be provided until after the end of the drop/add period. Verification will be mailed approximately 2 working days from the date of the request. Students who need enrollment verification should make a written request directly to: Enrollment Services, North Florida Community College, 325 NW Turner Davis Drive, Madison, FL 32340. Faxed requests will be accepted. FAX: 850/973-1697.

WITHDRAWING FROM A CLASS

Students who officially withdraw from a class by the published deadline receive a "W" grade for the class. A "W" counts as an attempt. If you stop attending class without officially withdrawing, you will receive a grade of "WF". It is up to the student to initiate the withdrawal procedure. The Withdrawal Form must be completed and processed in the Registrar's Office to officially withdraw from a course. Students withdrawing from all courses must complete the Withdrawal Permit. The Withdrawal Permit is designed to document that the student has satisfied all obligations to the College.

SPECIAL INFORMATION FOR COLLEGE PREP STUDENTS

There are additional options for college prep students. In accordance with Florida law, students may use Adult Basic Education, Adult Secondary Education, or private provider instruction as an alternative to traditional college preparatory instruction.

EXCESS HOURS ADVISORY STATEMENT

Section 1009.286, Florida Statutes, establishes an "excess hour" surcharge for a student seeking a baccalaureate degree at a state university. It is critical that students including those entering Florida Colleges are aware of the potential for additional course fees. "Excess hours" are defined as hours that go beyond 120% of the hours required for a baccalaureate degree program. For example, if the length of the program is 120 credit hours, the student may be subject to an excess hour surcharge for any credits attempted beyond 144 credit hours (12 x 120%). All students whose

educational plan may include earning a bachelor's degree should make every effort to enroll in and successfully complete those courses that are required for their intended major on their first attempt. Florida College students intending to transfer to a state university should identify a major or "transfer program" early and be advised of admission requirements for that program, including the approved common prerequisites. Course withdrawals and/or repeats, as well as enrollment in courses non-essential to the intended major, may contribute to a potential excess hour surcharge.

GRADUATION

Students must apply in writing for graduation. Graduation applications are available in the Registrar's Office. **Students must complete a graduation application, in order to receive a diploma or certificate, even if they do not desire to participate in the commencement ceremony.** See the calendar for deadlines concerning graduation.

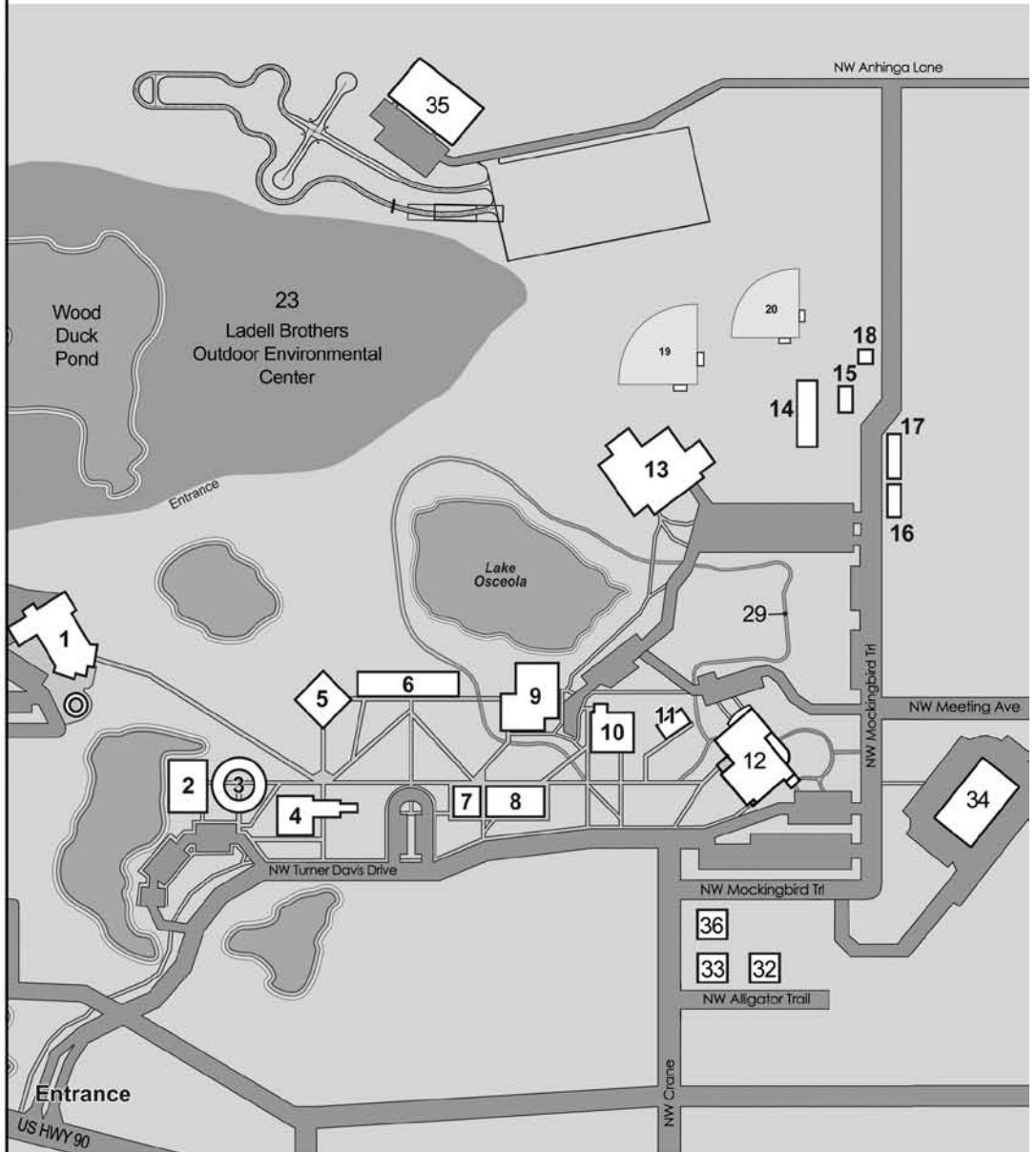
