


NFCC Library – FINDING FULL TEXT ARTICLES

- Go to the Student Center and get an NFCC student ID with a barcode on it.
- Go to the library and have your barcode activated.
- Access the library's home page: **www.nfcc.edu/library**.
- Click on ***Full-Text Databases***.
- Enter your barcode number from your student ID card as your borrower ID.
- Enter your PIN (last four digits of your Social Security Number).


